## Library Certification for SDGs

### Background

- In 2019 Chora 2030 developed a SDG certification programme for schools
- The programme inspired a local library to ask for a similar programme for libraries
- Chora 2030 and the Danish Library Association decided to collaborate on developing a library model
- In 2021 a pilot project was initiated with participation of 20 libraries



### The library programme

- Has been co-developed by libraries
- Offers support and a structure for libraries new to the agenda
- Can be a way to rethink or develop the role of the library – new ways to involve and engage citizens and new partners
- Addresses a request from the Danish library sector to play an active role in the sustainability agenda



# Today

- The programme is managed by Chora 2030
- Part of the DB2030 network administered by Danish Library Association
- Open for all interested libraries in Denmark (small participation fee is charged)
- Currently 28 libraries are part of the programme. 18 has been certified.



## 3 levels in the programme

- 1. Citizen level
  - Provide knowledge and possibilities to act
- 2. Community level
  - Involve citizens in local civic groups
    for sustainability
  - Collaborate with local organisations
    on sustainable activities
- 3. Institution level
  - Involve employees in finding sustainable solutions in-house
